Currently, the object that is ubiquitously used throughout this COVID-19 pandemic is the respiratory mask. Much like how Marquis took a functional object and made it nonfunctional and used its design to reference protest, this project will do the same with the respiratory mask.

MATERIALS:

Multicolor construction paper

Stencils

Markers

Respiratory mask

Ruler

LEARNING STANDARDS:

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Fold a respiratory mask in half.
- 2. Place mask on top of your construction paper with the folded end towards the middle.
- 3. Use the mask as a stencil and trace the outline.
- 4. Fold your construction paper in half.
- 5. Cut the design out of the construction paper so that only the mask-shape remains.
- Use this mask-shaped stencil to make other masks.
- 7. Make a stars and stripes design on some of the masks.
- 8. Make slogans and other designs on the masks you made to protest the pandemic or advise people to stay home.
