

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Choose a mythological hero and a pop-culture hero.
- 2. Draw two circles overlapping each other in the style of a Venn diagram.
- 3. In the left circle, draw or collage an image of your mythological hero. Do the same for your pop-culture hero in the right-hand circle.
- 4. Below each image, write a sentence or two describing your heroes with specific information about their powers, strengths, or identity.
- 5. In the overlapping space, write out the similar attributes you believe the two heroes share.
- 6. Share your hero comparison with your friends and family.
